Dear BYEP Family,

It has been an honor to partake in one of the most pivotal years at BYEP ever! In 2019 we provided a record 41,640 hours of programming to 129 kids, graduated a record number of seniors from our program, completed a beautiful \$1,000,000 renovation of our space, increased staffing, launched a new program for high school graduates, started a legacy endowment, and hit our financial goals! Wow, that's a lot to celebrate!

Our success gives me hope to address the challenges our community faces. Bozeman is the fastest growing small community in the country, with over 100 new people moving here per week. This growth creates immense opportunity, with new jobs, a strong economy and a new high school. There are also serious challenges that our growing community faces. The number of youth offenders in the Gallatin Valley has increased, the graduation rate has decreased and the overall number of teen suicides continues to grow. Did you know Montana has one of the highest teen suicide rates in the country?

Consistent with our mission, BYEP launched a \$100,000 campaign this year to fight suicide and promote wellness across the state of Montana this year. At BYEP, we are a glass half-full organization. We are looking to 2020 with hope and confidence in our ability to help the young people in our community flourish.

None of this would be possible without your generous support! In 2019 over 800 unique donors contributed to \$1,288,274 in program operations and over \$542,000 to our new building. The impact you have created for local kids in our community is beyond measure. Because of you, the youth in our community are less likely to go to jail, more likely to graduate from highschool, and are significantly less likely to take their own lives. I can't thank you enough!

As we move into 2020, I am full of hope for our kids and our community, and I want to thank you for all that you do to make BYEP what it is today. As a member of our family, you are invited to see our workshops in action and to meet the kids who benefit so much from your support. Mission Statement

Providing the most vulnerable teens in the Gallatin Valley with the opportunity to experience success.



With 160 participants, 10 free ski days might seem like a lot - but it's actually just the beginning of BYEP's programming.

BYEP participants are the young people most likely to fall through the cracks: those exposed to trauma, neglect, loss, homelessness, and other challenges outside of their control. BYEP's adventure-based mentorship program is designed to strengthen and support these participants in all aspects of their lives, and it starts by meeting them halfway - giving them something inspiring, if not downright awesome, to do every weekend.

Working with community partners, BYEP takes participants skiing and snowboarding at Big Sky Resort a total of 10 times each winter, providing them with 100% of the gear, transportation, and education they need to shred - all completely free of charge for each participant's family.

The real power of BYEP comes from it's world-class curriculum built around weekly workshops that teach participants the life skills that schools struggle to find the resources to address: from financial literacy and job interview skills to mindfulness, critical decision making, and community service.

The workshops combined with a weekend adventure add up to 10 hours of programming a week, and with BYEP programs running year round, each participant has access to a total of 360 hours of BYEP programming each year almost an hour a day, allowing Big Sky Youth Empowerment to achieve the depth of impact that turns a mentorship program into a community capable of changing and saving lives.

During each workshop, participants and mentors share their Highs & Lows for their past week, opening a space where each person in the group feels safe enough to share the most challenging aspects of their lives, knowing their story will be heard and respected. As simple as this may seem, these check-in sessions provide something missing in the lives of most people, not just the at-risk teen population: validation.






After an incredible Expansion Campaign in 2018, BYEP raised the funds required for a massive expansion and rennovation to our existing Headquarters on Mendenhall Avenue in Downtown Bozeman. Three times the size of the old BYEP HQ, our new space is set to open officially on April 3rd, 2020.

The extra space not only allows us to serve more young people in our community, it allows us to do so with an even higher quality of execution. 7TH GRADE - APPROACH

WINTER 2021 - It's no secret that middle school is one of the most challenging phases of a young person's development. By expanding the Approach Program to include 7th graders, BYEP can give participants a head start, equipping them with the life skills they'll need to navigate and succeed in middle school, and beyond.

POST-HIGH SCHOOL - ASCENT

Launched in the winter of 2020, our new Ascent program stays with our participants through their first year post-high school, guiding them through the complexities of adulthood and independent living. The Ascent Program focuses on life skills like applying for colleges and scholarships, personal financing, health care and housing, and career planning.





BYEP ENDOWMENT

Big Sky Youth Empowerment has launched an endowment through the Bozeman Area Community Foundation to help secure access to opportunities for the young people in Gallatin County for years to come. Participant Highlight: Luz Del Carmen



"BYEP gives you access to the tools you need to grow into the best version of yourself, but they don't force them on you. It's up to you to make the most of these opportunities."

Growing up in Belgrade, MT in a family where English isn't the first language would be a challenge for anyone. Now throw in a fight against anxiety and depression and it becomes easy to understand why Luz Del Carmen didn't always have a lot of hope for herself.

That changed in 8th grade when Luz del Carmen joined Big Sky Youth Empowerment. She found herself surrounded by people struggling with the same things she was, and learned through the adventures that even if she fell on the ski hill (or ran into trees!) that she could always get back up and try again.

She took that attitude into her school life, and with the encouragement of her BYEP mentors, Luz del Carmen signed up for the advanced math classes others said would be too hard.

She didn't stop there. Luz del Carmen pushed herself to apply for college, working with BYEP to win multiple scholarships. We are so proud to announce that Luz del Carmen will be attending Tufts University in Boston this fall on a full scholarship, pursuing her dream of becoming a research scientist.



Mentor Highlight: Maddy Brown



"I used to teach high school in Mississippi, so coming to BYEP was the best kind of culture shock. I was so used to working with teens in an academic setting, so it blew my mind seeing them be so vulnerable and open in workshops.

The more experienced kids model that vulnerablity for the new participants, speaking openly about their struggles with things like foster care or incarcerated parents. Their openness is what helps the new kids start to build trust. Trust is the foundation for BYEP's work, and it takes time and consistency to build that trust.

BYEP would not be what it is without the fluidity between workshops and adventures. There's value in discussing things like leadership or resiliance during workshops, but those concepts

become real skills during adventures, where BYEP creates a space where participants can actually practice and apply these concepts. Seemlessly integrating the life skills into adventures reinforces what participants learn and makes it real.

I mentored for BYEP for two years, during which BYEP became my community. Paricipants always say that BYEP is their family - mentors do too. BYEP cultivates such a unique and strong community, I know I'll keep and treasure these relationships for the rest of my life."


